Our methodology

How

We'll be working with a communicative approach (when I express myself, what do I say?). We invite you to put into action in your everyday life what you have learned in class, which will enable you to progress in your use of French in interaction.

Learning a language means making a commitment not only intellectually, but also emotionally and psychologically. FTC's French language course is therefore a safe place where you can freely share your questions, your difficulties, your doubts and your successes. This is our way to in an action-oriented approach.

Material

During these two levels, we'll be using the "*L'atelier* + A1" book. This manual is in line with the latest advances in language teaching proposed by the CEFR. In particular, it incorporates the notion of mediation and give a important place to pronunciation.



Course description

Course objectives

Level A1 is designed to prepare you for level A1. During this session, you'll discover how to express your first needs (buying, ordering, asking, meeting...) in French, you'll start writing in French, and finally you'll be able to talk about your problems. You'll use all the linguistic, pragmatic and sociocultural tools you need, drawing on the languages you know.

Learning outcomes

During this session we'll discover how to get to know each other in French by introducing ourselves and asking for information. We'll also look at how to express a need in general, and in particular in everyday life in a restaurant or clothes store, and learn how to give our opinion. Then we'll work on professional French, using the telephone and translating our LinkedIn profile into French. Finally, we'll start to familiarize ourselves with the notion of problem, crucial for the DELF B2!

- give information about matters of personal relevance (e.g. likes and dislikes, family, pets) using simple words/signs and basic expressions.
- produce simple isolated phrases and sentences.

3.1 Oral interaction Overall

At the end of the session, **you will be able to**...

- interact in a simple way but communication is totally dependent on repetition at a slower rate, rephrasing and repair.
- ask and answer simple questions, initiate and respond to simple statements in areas of immediate need or on very familiar topics.

3.2 Written interaction Overall

At the end of the session, you will be able to ...

• ask for or pass on personal details.

- understand short, very simple questions and statements, provided they are delivered slowly and clearly and accompanied by visuals or manual gestures to support understanding and repeated if necessary.
- recognize every day, familiar words/signs, provided they are delivered clearly and slowly in a clearly defined, familiar everyday context.
- recognize numbers, prices, dates and days of the week, provided they are delivered slowly and clearly in a defined, familiar everyday context.

• recognize familiar words/signs accompanied by pictures, such as a fast-food restaurant menu illustrated with photos or a picture book using familiar vocabulary.

• produce short phrases about themselves, giving basic personal information (e.g. name, address, family, nationality).

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2.2 Written production Overall

• ask and answer questions about themselves and daily routines, using short, formulaic expressions and relying on gestures to reinforce the information.

Workshop | Organization


